Questions About Federal Benefits?

As a member of this chapter -- or a family member or survivor of a chapter member - if you'd like information or assistance concerning federal benefits and programs, the chapter's service officer and assistant service officer are available to help you. We can assist you in contacting the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) concerning civil service annuities, survivor benefits, health insurance, life insurance, and income tax withholding from annuities. We also can give you information on other important programs, such as Medicare, Social Security, and veterans benefits.

Reminder to Federal Annuitants: Keep Your Records Current

It's the individual annuitant's personal responsibility to ensure his/her records are up-to-date at the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). At the time of retirement processing and as federal laws and personnel regulations change over the years, the individual will be furnished government forms and instructions concerning the applicable annuity and benefit programs.

After OPM has been notified of the death of an annuitant, the survivor is then provided the proper forms and instructions for keeping his or her records current.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT *Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)*

The Lame duck session began on November 13 and will give lawmakers just a few weeks to pass a deficitcutting bill that would have to cover defense spending, tax reform, domestic entitlement program reform and a score of other prickly and complex issues. The Congressional Budget Office report offers numerous deficit reduction strategies to help avert the potential crises of the so-called fiscal cliff. A couple of the strategies would apply to the federal workforce. 1) Reduce the across-the-board adjustment for defense and non-defense federal civilian employees' pay, and 2) Adopt a voucher plan and slow the growth of federal contributions for the Federal Employees Health Benefits program. Through the ongoing pay freeze and increased contributions to retirement, federal workers have already saved the federal government \$75 billion.

November 15 was NARFE National Call Congress Day. It is suggested that calls be made to the Capitol using NARFE's toll-free number 1-866-220-0044. Ask the operator to connect you to your representative and two senator's office. By using this number NARFE is able to keep track of how many calls were made. It is important that we establish a good relationship with our elected officials and express our concerns through these calls about issues that affect the federal workforce and retirees.

Due to the ongoing pay freeze the Federal Salary Council announced on Oct. 19 that the pay gap between government employees and private-sector workers grew by about 8 percent this year in favor of private-sector workers.

Also the Maryland Federation of Chapters will give \$10 to every member that switches to dues withholding. A DEFINITE WIN-WIN SITUATION!


