PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Elinor Abrell (301-831-8753)

The contentious midterm elections are now behind us (except for Florida). There is a short "lame duck" session of the current Congress with several 2019 appropriation bills still on the table that must be passed in order to avoid another continuing resolution. Once again the President is threatening a government shutdown if there is not funding voted for the wall. The New Year will bring with it a new Congress whose actions we will be watching with great interest. Remember that NARFE is always there, striving to protect and preserve the pay and earned benefits of federal employees and retirees, by making sure those interests stay before legislators.

<u>Third Friday.</u> For many years now this has been the date of Chapter 409's monthly luncheons. The Executive Committee would like to hear from members: is this a good date for you or would you be better able to come to luncheons if they were on some other date, for example 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday or 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday .....or does the date not matter at all? # LEGISLATIVE David Carmack (240-578-4965)

The most urgent issue at this time is the pay raise for federal employees for calendar year 2019. The President has recommended no pay raise. Tied in with appropriations, the federal employees' pay raise for calendar year 2019 depends upon reconciliation of the Senate version of H.R. 6147, which recommended a 1.9 percent raise, and of the House version of H.R. 6147, which is silent on this issue. So far, there has been no

action on this by the Conference Committee. Unless Congress approves a pay raise, the President's decision of "no pay raise" will stand. The President's other recommendations with respect to federal employees, which recommendations have been detailed in prior issues of The Key Notes, are still pending before Congress.
