#### President's Message (Elinor Abrell • 301-831-8753)

The November luncheon meeting was attended by 40 members and guests who came to hear FEHB updated information. Representatives were present from Aetna, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Kaiser Permanente, and United Health Care to give an overview of provided coverage, as well as answer questions. This information is helpful as we are now in Open Season, a time to assess health needs for the coming year and explore the offerings of these companies to determine the coverage plan that best meets these needs. Any health care change must be made by **Monday**, **December 12**.

This is a Christmas story before there was a NARFE. During the early 1800s in the northern U.S. Christmas was just another day and not celebrated at all. However, Christmas was an important part of the social season in the southern states. In fact, the first state to declare Christmas a legal holiday was Alabama in 1836, followed by Louisiana and Arkansas in 1838. After the Civil War Christmas traditions and celebrations began to spread across the country. In 1870 an Illinois Representative introduced a bill to make December 25, Christmas, a national holiday. The bill was approved and sent to the Senate, where it also passed, with the addition of three more holidays: New Years Day, Fourth of July, and Thanksgiving. President Ulysses Grant signed this legislation in June 1870 . . . but there was a catch. The only people who got the day off were Federal employees in the District of Columbia. Feds in the rest of the country had to wait until 1885 to enjoy this benefit. (Note: In February 1921, a group of 14 Federal retirees gathered in Washington, DC to form an association to improve the status and protect the earned benefits of all Federal employees, retirees, and their survivors . . . and thus NARFE was established.)

## Reminder to Federal Annuitants: Keep Your Records Current

It's the individual annuitant's personal responsibility to ensure that his/her records are up-to-date at the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). Notify OPM (<a href="https://opm.gov/retire">https://opm.gov/retire</a>) if you change your address, bank account for annuity deposits, designation of a survivor or beneficiary, etc.

After OPM has been notified of a change, the annuitant (or, when OPM is notified of the death of an annuitant, the survivor) is provided the proper forms and instructions.
