## President's Message (Elinor Abrell • 301-831-8753)

As the year 2021 closes, we can look back as well as look forward. COVID-19, along with its variants, was still present, but mitigation and protection came with the availability of vaccines. This enabled Chapter 409 to resume in-person luncheon meetings in September, with those members attending feeling safe and happy to be able to gather as a group. Now, as we start 2022, *omicron* variant has us taking a step backward to ensure our health and safety, with the need to mask, social distance, test as needed, and avoid large groups. Going into a second year, there is indeed a sense of weariness and complacency.

NARFE wrapped up its 100th year of advocacy in 2021, with its team looking toward the work that lies ahead in 2022. This is a Congressional midterm election year, as the entire House of Representatives and one-third of the Senate are up for re-election of current, or election of new, lawmakers. Campaigns are certain to be contentious, given the political climate of today. NARFE-PAC will focus on advocating NARFE's legislative priorities and supporting those candidates who do so. This is accomplished through attending campaign events, meeting with and thanking incumbents who have supported NARFE, and educating those who have not, and engagement by phone calls, letter writing, and social media. It is important that NARFE members get to know the candidates for whom they may be voting, as well as the campaign issues of the candidates. Contributing to NARFE-PAC is a way to support these advocacies.

Chapter 409 will also be having an election in 2022 for officers and members of the Executive Committee. The last election, held in 2020, was never completed, as COVID interrupted. As there were no meetings or business for some 19 months, those proposed candidates (mostly incumbents) simply stayed in place. Our Chapter, like many other organizations, finds it difficult to find volunteers willing to step up and serve. NARFE's mission is to preserve and protect <u>your</u> earned pay and benefits. It is most certainly in the best interest of all members that Chapter 409 remains strong and viable, but this will require some volunteer time and service. We are so much more than just a "lunch bunch"! Know that other chapters facing this problem have either dissolved or joined with another chapter. There is a little poem that says in part: if Everybody thinks that Somebody will do the job that almost Anybody can do, then Nobody steps up ... and the job never gets done.

#### Legislative Report (David Carmack • 240-578-4965)

Congress has passed, and the President has signed, a Continuing Resolution to fund the government at FY 2021 levels through February 18, 2022. Congress has also passed, and the President has signed, a bill to lift the debt ceiling. Thus, the Federal Government is able to pay its obligations, including Social Security and pensions, that it has incurred. A bill (H.R. 6066), which NARFE strongly supports, has been introduced to strengthen the Office of Personnel Management.

# **Alzheimer's Report** (Kathy Siggins • 301-829-2462)

Wishing you a healthy and Happy New Year! As we welcome in the New Year, I'd like to highlight some major milestones in Alzheimer's achievements for 2021. In June the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved Aduhelm (aducanumba) for the treatment of Alzheimer's, the first new treatment approved for Alzheimer's since 2003. Currently available therapies only treat symptoms of the disease; this treatment option is the first therapy to target and affect the underlying disease process of Alzheimer's.

In September, NARFE members exceeded their National Goal of \$14 million by the end of 2022 for NARFE-Alzheimer's Research. A new National goal of \$15 million by the end of 2024 was set with the approval of NARFE Headquarters and the National Alzheimer's Committee

As of November 2021, the USPS has sold 9.5 million Alzheimer's Stamps, raising more than \$1.2 million for Alzheimer's research at NIH. NARFE's National Walk to End Alzheimer's Team has raised a total of \$75,643 to date, and Team HOPE is still holding strong in first place nationally at \$8,125. Thank you all so very much for your generosity and support of the Alzheimer's cause. Together we will find a cure and finally achieve a world without Alzheimer's.
