CO-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I was asked to write this month's newsletter and I have chosen to excerpt points from an article on "speaking with people with <u>Alzheimer's"</u>. It was written by Carole Larkin, a Geriatric Care Manager in Texas.

- 1. **Make eye contact.** Always approach them face-to-face and make eye contact. Read their eyes. Always approach from the front, as approaching and speaking from the side or from behind can startle them.
- 2. **Be at their level.** Move your head to be at the same level as their head. Bend your knees or sit down to reach their level. Do not stand or hover over them it is intimidating and scary.
- 3. **Tell them what you are going to do before you do it.** They need to know what is coming first so that they don't think that you are grabbing them.
- 4. **Speak calmly.** Always speak in a calm manner with an upbeat tone of voice, even if you don't feel that way
- 5. **Speak slowly.** Speak at one half of your normal speed when talking to them. Take a breath between each sentence. Give them a chance to catch up to your words.
- 6. **Speak in short sentences.** Speak in short direct sentences with only one idea to a sentence.
- 7. **Only ask one question at a time.** Let them answer it before you ask another question. You can ask who, what, where and when, but NOT why. Why is too complicated.
- 8. **Don't say "remember".** Many times they will not be able to do so, and you are just pointing out to them their shortcomings.

- 9. **Turn negatives into positives.** For example say "Let's go here" instead of "Don't go there". Be inclusive and don't talk down to them as if they were a child
- 10. **Do not argue with them.** It gets you nowhere. Instead, validate their feelings. For example "It sounds like you miss your mother. You love them very much, don't you? Tell me about the time..." Then ask for one of their favorite stories about that person.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

The "debt-limit suspension" impasse failed to materialize on Feb. 11th, when House Leader Rep. John Boehner (R-OH)-, in a surprise move, introduced a "clean" bill to suspend the debt ceiling until March 2015. The House approved the bill by a vote of 221to 201. On Feb. 12, Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-OH) and his Republican leadership team joined Democrats and voted to end a potential GOP filibuster. The vote exceeded the two third required majority rule. The Senate then voted by a party line vote, 55 to 43, to pass the same legislation and send it to the President for his signature.

Also, after the House passed a bill on Feb. 11 to restore military retiree COLA benefits to veterans who are under 62, the Senate on Feb. 12 voted, 95-3, to adopt the House bill and send it to the President. The bill also extends sequestration levels to Medicare spending.

As determined in October, federal retirees received a 1.5% COLA in January. For individuals receiving

insurance benefits under FECA, the December 2013 COLA of 229.174 was 1.5% higher than Dec. 2012. They will receive a 1.5% in March.

Another great champion of federal workers and retirees, Rep. Henry Waxman, D-CA, announced that 2014 would be his last year in Congress. Waxman, serving in his 40th year in the House, chaired the committee with jurisdiction for federal service and retirement for four years.

Senate legislation to overhaul the U.S. Postal Service, <u>S. 1486</u>, began on January 29, 2014. NARFE is opposed to the Carper/Coburn substitute because it would severely diminish, or authorize the elimination of, long-standing employee benefits, especially workers' compensation benefits. NARFE President Joseph A. Beaudoin sent a <u>letter</u> to each senator on the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee in advance of the markup.

Our "Enough Is Enough" message has just been updated and is ready for members to send to their congressional delegations. NARFE's Legislative Action Center makes this very straightforward.

Alzheimer's advocates recently achieved a major policy victory - the inclusion of *\$122 million in additional Alzheimer's disease funding* in the FY14 "omnibus" appropriations bill, our largest increase ever. Particularly in these difficult budgetary times on Capitol Hill, this is a tremendous success. This funding will go a long way in implementing the National Alzheimer's Plan goal of preventing and effectively treating Alzheimer's by 2025.

Advocates, through their involvement and support, were invited to a a special hearing before the U.S. Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, on February 26th,

where we were able to thank the bi-partisan leadership and begin advocacy for the 2015 budget.

In January Chapter 409 had one (1) person transfer out and nine (9) who were dropped for non-renewal of membership. With two reinstatements and two transferred in to 409 the net is six fewer members. SERVICE OFFICER REPORT Chuck Caloia (301-938-2000)

Last summer OPM Retirement Services introduced a way for annuitants and survivors to use their Services Online (SOL) account to receive their annual notice and IRS Form 1099R. Since then, thousands have signed up to receive these mailings using SOL. OPM expects even greater enrollment this year.

Eighty-seven percent of annuitants who participated in an OPM customer survey indicated their overall satisfaction with SOL. OPM has stated that it will continue to keep SOL secure and easy for users to access now and in the future.

One objective of SOL is to help reduce OPM's carbon footprint by reducing the number of mailings it sends out.

To sign up, visit <u>www.ServicesOnline.opm.gov</u>. If you don't remember your password, directions for obtaining a new one are given. SOL passwords expire after 15 months of non-use.
