PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Elinor Abrell (301-831-8753)

Chapter 409 is pleased to welcome this month two special guests: Dr. Gary Roundtree and Dr. Sudha President and Vice Haley, 1^{st} President respectively, of the Maryland Federation of NARFE. Both Dr. Roundtree and Dr. Haley are huge advocates for the interests of NARFE members and work diligently to ensure that our voices are heard by elected officials at both state and national levels. They especially like to focus on educating and empowering retirees to deal with both opportunities and challenges they may face. Dr. Roundtree and Dr. Haley have made it their mission over the past year to visit all 28 Maryland chapters, calling this a "Chapter Spotlight Tour", to bring the message of what NARFE is actively doing to promote and protect the federal employee and retiree. In addition they want to hear back from chapter members, their thoughts and suggestions, what they see as concerns and future priorities, and perhaps some ways to find solutions. What they seek to gain from this visit is some insight for the future of the Maryland Federation, what should be the mission, focus, and priorities to pursue for real and sustainable improvements. Chapter 409 members, come, listen, and participate!

There are two long years (almost) and lots of politics ahead until the 2020 elections. One way to stay informed and vigilant about what is going on in the Maryland legislature, now in session, is to use the website of the MD Federation, really now a simple task. First, google "MD NARFE" and click on the "Maryland Federation of NARFE." Then, in the upper right corner click on "Legislative-State Page." You will then have access to an abundance of information on legislative issues. If you wish to make your thoughts known to your elected officials in Annapolis, use the link "What you can do about it." This will enable you to directly contact your officials and leads you through several ways to do so, even providing a sample letter that could be used. Remember that there is power in numbers and numbers (voters) matter to legislators. Use your voice to protect your interests and try this process....it is really user friendly.

LEGISLATIVE David Carmack (240-578-4965)

The threat of another federal government shutdown appears to have receded for the time being as lawmakers line up behind a legislative compromise to fund fully the federal government, a compromise that the President may accept. But the threat to federal government operations will occur later this Congressional session when the Congress and the President must agree to raise the debt ceiling.

The legislation to fund fully the federal government also includes a pay raise for federal civilian employees for the calendar year 2019 of 1.9 percent. This action overrides the pay freeze put in place by the President.

On February 7, 2019, a bill, known as the FAIR ACT, was reintroduced in the House to provide a 3.6 percent boost to federal pay in calendar year 2020 in order to close the growing gap between federal and private sector pay and to stave off the possibility of another pay freeze in 2020.

At the State level, there is still no resolution as to whether the computation of the state income tax will be decoupled from the computation of the federal income tax so that a taxpayer could claim the standard deduction in computing federal income tax and itemize deductions in computing state income tax.
