LEGISLATIVE REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

Budget Resolution Wins House Majority

On April 10, the House approved the fiscal year 2015 budget resolution (H.Con.Res.96) introduced by House Budget Committee Chairman Paul D. Ryan, R-WI, by a vote of <u>219-205</u>. This resolution serves as the GOP's blueprint to balance the budget in 10 years through massive spending cuts. Twelve Republicans joined all Democrats in opposition. Passage came after the House had debated, and defeated, five alternative budget blueprints. One of these, offered by the Republican Study Committee, included a switch to the Chained CPI for the purpose of determining annual cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs). The Ryan budget assumes savings of \$125 billion over 10 years by requiring existing federal employees to contribute substantially more toward their retirement. Since funding levels for FY 2015 were set with passage of a two-year budget agreement earlier this year, the Ryan budget is more statement than policy and will not be considered further.

Alzheimer's is the most expensive disease in America, with costs set to skyrocket in the years ahead. This was our battle cry as 900 advocates nationwide, stormed Capitol Hill on April 9^{th.} The growing Alzheimer's crisis is helping to bankrupt America. In 2014 the total cost of Alzheimer's will be \$214 billion,

including \$150 billion to Medicare and Medicaid. Only 0.25% (\$566 million) of this total has been committed to Alzheimer's research, the only path to reducing this cost. Questions About Federal Benefits?

As a member of this chapter -- or a family member or survivor of a chapter member -- if you'd like information or assistance concerning federal benefits and programs, the chapter's service officer and assistant service officer are available to help you. We can assist you in contacting the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) concerning civil service annuities, survivor benefits, health insurance, life insurance, and income tax withholding from annuities. We also can give you information on other important programs, such as Medicare, Social Security, and veterans benefits.

Reminder to Federal Annuitants: Keep Your Records Current

It's the individual annuitant's personal responsibility to ensure his/her records are up-to-date at the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). At the time of retirement processing and as federal laws and

personnel regulations change over the years, the individual will be furnished government forms and instructions concerning the applicable annuity and benefit programs.

After OPM has been notified of the death of an annuitant, the survivor is then provided the proper forms and instructions for keeping his or her records current.
