As a NARFE member, it is important to stay alert to relevant Congressional happenings (narfe magazine covers this well). Then, stay involved by using your voice to contact your legislator when it matters, thus adding to the strength of the NARFE message. Numbers do have power!

LEGISLATIVE David Carmack (240-578-4965)

As reported earlier in *The Key Notes*, the President is pressing his request, found in his proposed budget for fiscal 2020, to merge the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) and the General Services Administration (GSA). NARFE has serious concerns with this reorganization plan because it places human resource solutions, retirement services, and the administration of health care and insurance programs for the federal community into an organization where such concerns for the federal community are likely to receive insufficient attention and resources.
