CO-PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our speaker for the November luncheon will be Bill Gray from Blue Cross and Blue Shield (BC/BS) who will focus on the Federal Employees Health Benefit Program and how the Affordable Care Act will impact BC/BS coverage. I'm sure many of you have questions so please try to attend and bring a friend. I'd like to also remind you of the 11th Annual Federal Employees Health Benefits forums that Congressman Chris Van Hollen is hosting in cooperation with NARFE. His first forum will be held at the Holiday Park Senior Center, 3950 Ferrara Drive, Wheaton, MD 20906 on Monday morning, November 18th at 9 a.m. His second will be held at the Executive Office Building, 101 Monroe Street, Rockville, MD 20850 on Wednesday evening, November 20th at 7 p.m.. The third and final forum will be held at Calvary United Methodist Church, 403 South Main Street, Mount Airy, MD 21771 on Friday morning, November 22nd at 10 a.m. I encourage everyone to attend one of the forums where experts on federal health insurance plans and representatives of health insurance carriers will be present at all three forums to discuss various health plan options and the impact of the Affordable Care Act, and to answer questions. The forums are open to the public and registration is NOT required so plan to bring all your neighbors and friend.

The answers to the various questions asked at the September Luncheon Meeting of Rep.Van Hollen's representative were answered later via email by Sarah Schenning, the Legislative Director of Rep. Van Hollen. They are as follows: Rep. Van Hollen is opposed to the use of the Chained CPI. He feels it would not be an accurate reflection of true costs (especially health care) and therefore could be very harmful to seniors. In regards to the COLAs and FEHBP, Rep."Van Hollen supports a strong COLA based on fair assessments of consumer prices in order to protect the federal annuity from inflation." "Any increase in FEHBP premiums places an undue burden on retirees who have few means to offset these costs and adds an additional burden on current employees who have been buffered by a pay freeze, unpaid furloughs, and now the Editor: Scott Darby 14 S. threat of a government shutdown. To reduce the financial burden on retirees who pay into FEHBP, (he) supports and has sponsored legislation to permit federal civilian retirees ... to pay FEHBP ... premiums on a pretax basis." In regard to the federal pay freeze, which has been in effect for three years, the congressman opposed the freeze. Federal employees "deserve our constant respect; they don't deserve to be treated like a piggy-bank." In regards to the so-called "Stop Government Abuse Act", Congressman Van Hollen opposed this bill "because the bill eliminates due process protections for members of the Senior Executive Service by allowing agency heads to fire SES employees without giving them advance notice or an opportunity to address the allegations against them" He also "opposed the bill because it would limit bonuses federal workers may receive to 5% of basic pay during sequestration and limit the number of Senior Executives who may receive performance awards to 33% of those eligible in each agency. He believes the bill will harm our government's ability to attract the best and brightest managers, make it more difficult to retain current employees, and exacerbate personnel shortages in nursing, information technology, cyber security, and acquisition where shortages have been a major concern for some time." [This bill passed the House but has not been taken up by the Senate.] NOTE: These same questions were given to Rep. Delaney's staff but no comments have been received to date.

Attention Ham Radio Operators: One of our chapter members, Bill Welsh, has moved to Maine and he is a ham radio operator (KB1WEA). He wonders if there are any other ham radio operators in Chapter 409. He would like to make contact/hear from them.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

On October 9th, NARFE, joined by the Military Officers of America and the American Foreign Services Association, held a press conference on the grounds of the U.S. Capitol to oppose a proposed change to the method of calculating annual cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) that would hurt senior, military retirees and disable veterans. In reaction to the suggestion of some Members of Congress that moving to the Chained CPI would mean seniors and retirees would JUST have to clip a few more coupons to make up for the difference in benefit cuts. The press conference focused on 44 shoeboxes containing \$113,000 worth of coupons that members were asked to clip and send into NARFE Headquarters. If the Chained CPI were adopted for calculating our Cost of Living Adjustments the average retiree would lose \$48,000 in 25 years. That's a lot of coupons. Retirement benefits shouldn't be shrinking as federal workers; retirees and disable veterans get older. FERS retirees eligible for Social Security plus Retirement would receive a double whammy while CSRS retirees would receive a single whammy. NARFE opposes the move to Chained CPI.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT Bill Elsen, Membership (301-663-4027)

In September Chapter 409 had two new members join us. They are Norma Brinkley-Staley and Peggy Sanders who are both active Federal Employees. Three members transferred into our chapter from Chapter 2363, the echapter. They are John McCurdy, Mary Clifford, and Olga Warren. All three had mistakenly been put in Chapter 2363 after their membership lapsed and they applied to be reinstated. Four members were re-instated: Edith Barnhill, Robert Fischer and Nancy Wynne (both active federal employees), and Lillian Mann. Seven members were dropped for non-renewal of their membership. They are Mark Brown, Issac Fish, Deborah Guy, John Kondig, Barbara Reeder, Ralph Wachter, and Beatrice Zastrow. If you know any of these members please contact them and encourage them to re-join. In the category of New Prospective Members listed in the Chapter 409 Activity Report (M-112) by the National Office for September there were 24 names of people who live in Frederick County. I will be writing to them, inviting them to join our chapter as 409 members. This gives us a net gain of two members and hopefully we will get some of the 24 Prospective Members to join us.
