## November Is FEHB Month

Federal annuitants, retirees, and survivors have an Open Season opportunity from November 13 through December 11 to make changes to their health benefits coverage for the coming year. OPM has announced that the average FEHB program premium will have an increase of 4% for 2018, with the average enrollee's share rising 6.1%.

While this increase may be considered modest, it is important for each individual to ask some questions. Has my current plan met my needs for the past year? Was it affordable? What are my known medical needs for the coming year? Is there a planned surgery? What about prescription medicines coverage? Vision needs? Dental needs? This may be a good time to "shop" what is available in this market.

At our November Chapter 409 luncheon meeting, the program will address FEHB. David Hurka, representative from Blue Cross/Blue Shield, will bring us up to date with actions of OPM, how the carriers are reacting, and what this all means for us. In addition to Mr. Hurka, representatives from these carriers will be present to give a brief overview of their carrier's plans: Aetna, GEHA, Kaiser-Permanente, United Health Care, and American Postal Workers. After the presentation each rep will be available to answer individual questions and have hand-out materials. Carriers no longer provide much in the way of printed informational materials to their customers. The internet is now the primary source of such information. Take some time to look at sites for your current carrier as well as any other ones of interest. FEHB information can also be found on the *narfe.org* website and in the coming November *narfe* magazine. Now is the time to think smart and make the best decisions for 2018 health benefits.

## LEGISLATIVE Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

Federal retirees will receive a 2.0 percent cost-ofliving adjustment (COLA) for civil service annuities, Social Security benefits and military retirement annuities in 2018. Each year's COLA is determined by comparing the change in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) for the third quarter months of the year (July, August and September) with the average for the third quarter of the last year in which a COLA became effective.

House Bill H.R. 1251, **CPI-E Act of 2017,** would require a switch to use the Consumer Price Index for the Elderly (CPI-E) which would better take into account prices of consumer goods purchased by retirees, who spend more on health care, instead of the current **CPI-W** which fails to accurately measure seniors' spending. Health care accounts for 12 percent of spending for those 62 and older, but only 5 percent for the general population calculated under **CPI-W.** NARFE members are encouraged to use the <u>NARFE</u> <u>Legislative Action Center</u> to quickly and easily send letters to members of Congress and ask them to support the passage of the CPI-E Act of 2017, and stand up for the interests of the federal community, our nation's seniors, and our veterans.

The House of Representatives passed legislation that would create more flexible withdrawal options for the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP), granting federal workers greater control over their retirement. NARFE applauds this move and encourages the Senate to quickly follow their House colleagues in passing the bill.

ALZHEIMER'S REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

We finally did it. US Postal Service announced that Alzheimer's has been selected as the first semipostal stamp to be issued under the USPS Discretionary Semipostal Stamp Program. The stamp will be unveiled in November for National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month, and just in time for your Christmas mailings. The semipostal stamp will cost a little more than regular first class postage stamps, with the extra funds going to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to search for better treatments, prevention, and a cure for Alzheimer's and related dementias. The Walk to End Alzheimer's was held on October 15, with 1,100 walkers raising over \$209,000 to support families living with Alzheimer's. Donations will continue to be accepted through the end of November.


