NATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

JD Brooks and Kathy Siggins recently joined some 900 other delegates, members and guest at the 34th Biennial National Convention of NARFE held in Reno, NV, August 28 - September 1. represents the interest of five million federal employees, retirees, spouses and survivors. highlight of the convention was the re-election by acclamation of the National Officers, President Richard G. Thissen and National Secretary/Treasurer Jon Dowie, who will guide NARFE over the next two years. This will be their second, and final, two-year In addition, 10 regional vice presidents from term. around the country were elected. The Convention delegates also voted to adopt NARFE's Legislative Agenda which will be a guideline for the NARFE Legislative Department over the course of the 115th Congressional Session. And, delegates affirmed a new goal of \$13 million for Alzheimer's research by 2018. Please mark your calendar to join us in Jacksonville, FL, in 2018, and in Phoenix, AZ in 2020, for the next NARFE National Convention and beyond.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

The Resolution Committee approved 16 of the 48 resolutions to move forward for a vote at the

convention. There were three resolutions that the National Executive Board (NEB) submitted as priority: Providing for Optional Chapter Membership, Authorizing the NEB to Adjust National Dues within specific Limits, and going to One Member, One Vote. Only two of the 16 resolutions were adopted, Optional Chapter Membership and One Member, One Vote. Please check your *narfe* magazine for more details.

The Legislative Program, reflecting the six additional recommended resolutions by the Legislative Committee was adopted. New language was added involving the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) and the Medicare Part B "hold harmless" provision. Specifically, NARFE supports legislation that would allow TSP participants more flexible withdrawal options from their TSP accounts. NARFE also supports applying the effect of the hold harmless provision to all Medicare beneficiaries permanently. A breakdown of the legislative priorities for the 115th Congress will be made available in the January 2017 edition of *narfe* magazine.

ALZHEIMER'S REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

The Alzheimer's Committee approved funding for four new research projects prior to the start of the convention. Since 1985, NARFE members have donated more than \$11.9 million to advance Alzheimer's research and to date, have funded through grants, 71 research projects. Alzheimer's research is NARFE's charity of choice. Harry Johns, President and CEO of the Alzheimer's Association thanked NARFE's leaders and members for their support of research. "When the history is written about the success we ultimately have in treating and even preventing Alzheimer's disease, NARFE will have been a significant part of that change" he said. also thanked NARFE for their new partnership in creating a NARFE National Walk to End Alzheimer's Unlike our national goal, monies raised Team.

through the 600 walks will help local Alzheimer's chapters to provide care and support to families in local communities.
