LEGISLATIVE

President Trump has set the civilian federal employees pay raise for 2018 at 1.9 percent. The pay raise includes a 1.4 percent across-the-board increase and an average additional increase of 0.5 percent in localitybased pay adjustments. In a show of bipartisanship, the White House and congressional leaders have agreed to a short-term Continuing Resolution to fund the government, raise the debt ceiling and provide disaster aid in response to Hurricane Harvey. The agreement funds the government and extends the debt ceiling deadline until December 8, allowing lawmakers more time to pass a budget and debate the debt ceiling. This move pushes back any decisions regarding budget proposals affecting the federal community, such as eliminating the Federal Employees Retirement System Annuity Supplement and decreasing or eliminating cost-of-living adjustments.

ALZHEIMER'S REPORT Kathy Siggins (301-829-2462)

Nearly 400 advocates from 37 states including the District of Columbia, representing 150 causes, attended the Rally for Medical Research in September to urge Congress to continue the momentum of robust, sustained, and predictable funding by providing a \$2 billion increase for the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Fiscal Year 2018.

On August 8, 2017, country music legend Glen Campbell passed away from Alzheimer's disease. Glen and his family chose to publicly document his journey from diagnosis, through the end of his career. Through his Good-bye Tour Glen and his family were able to raise awareness and advocate for increased funding for Alzheimer's research while on Capitol Hill.
