<< Legíslatíve Report >> David Carmack • 240-578-4965

The Federal Employee Paid Leave Act (FEPLA) has been incorporated into H.R. 2500, the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for fiscal year 2020. The FEPLA provides federal employees with 12 weeks of paid leave following the birth or adoption of a child. H.R. 2500 is currently pending in the House of Representatives. The Senate has passed its defense authorization bill, which does not include the paid leave provision. NARFE supports the House bill.

The House of Representatives passed the Fiscal Year 2020 Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act, which includes a 3.1% average federal employee pay raise and blocks the Administration from moving forward on its proposed reorganization of the Office of Personnel Management. The Senate has not taken up this bill.

The House of Representatives has approved a bill to repeal the 40% excise tax on high-value employee-provided working and retiree health benefits (the so-called Cadillac tax), that was included in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010. The Senate has not taken action on this bill to repeal the Cadillac tax. NARFE supports the repeal of this tax.

Hey Gang – Hope you all had a wonderful summer or, at least, not get injured. First, I would like to thank Michaela Saccoccio for forwarding to me the NARFE recruitment advertisement that appeared in the June issue of the "Postal Supervisor" magazine. Chuck Caloia, our Chapter Service Officer, asked me at our last luncheon if there was an initiative to make postal employees aware of our organization and membership benefits. I didn't know the

answer to Chuck's question; however, I knew whom to ask. We need to do a better job of attracting more/younger chapter members to share the chapter workload.

NARFE Headquarters recently updated their website that provides chapter officers with a user-friendly dashboard that provides useful statistical data. From a chapter membership perspective, the dashboard reports that we currently have 470 chapter members and provides us with a new search capability. Using this search engine, I was able to look at a year's worth of data and determine that since August 2018, we had 4 members transferred out of our chapter; 4 members transfer into our chapter; 16 members were dropped for non-renewal of their membership, and 14 members had passed away in this same time period. Moreover, we had 56 PROSPECTIVE members, but only added 4 new members to our chapter roster between August 2018 and August 2019 according to the NARFE Headquarters database. While our chapter president, Elinor Abrell, with the assistance of Vicki Yanez, has been sending a welcoming correspondence to prospective members as a NARFE information package, perhaps you can serve as a goodwill ambassador at your luncheon table to identify/assist a newbie. Like I said, we need to do a better job of recruiting new folks and everyone needs to make them feel welcome.
