I don't want to get too political here, but I think the Federal workforce may be in for a trying two to four years. There are conversations on reductions in the workforce and moving agencies out of the Washington, DC area, and more. This would be a major disruption to many lives. The area housing and tax base would take a major hit.

There were two articles about the Post Office in the December 14-15 weekend newspaper. The first was about a major restructuring of the Post Office. Both parties want the Post Office to be self-supporting. How it gets there is the debate. The second article is the one that scares me as a NARFE member. Some people want to completely privatize the Post Office. Were this to happen, we would lose all current and future Post Office employees as prospective members, just like this year's health insurance open season, when the Post Office employees were pulled out of our insurance plans. These two actions – the proposed privatization and the removal of the Post Office from our health insurance – could negatively affect our membership and bargaining strength. Another Post Office proposal is to take all their insurance and retirement funds and invest them. This sounds good when the market is doing well but could be risky long term.

Please be careful of scams. Don't volunteer information to incoming calls – some of these calls sound very convincing. Also, don't open documents attached to emails from unknown senders. There have been articles in the papers that are recommending not to text from Apple phones to Android phones and vice versa, only Apple to Apple or Android to Android. I don't know what kind of phones my friends have. Please, just be careful.

Congress reached a bipartisan deal to keep the government running through March 14, 2025. The Senate sent the spending package to President Biden by a vote of 85 to 11, hours after the House voted 366 to 34 to approve it. The President has signed it.

Congress also passed the <u>Social Security Fairness Act</u> (H.R. 82 / S. 597), which would eliminate the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO). The Senate approved the bill by a vote of 70-26. It was passed by the House in November and now goes to the President's desk to be signed.

#### **Alzheimer's Report** (Kathy Siggins • 301-829-2462)

As of December 12, NARFE's National Walk to End Alzheimer's Teams have raised \$80,436 towards their goal of \$100,000 for the 2024 Walk. Currently nationwide, Chapter 409's Team HOPE is the Top Fundraising Team raising \$9,400 with Kathy Siggins as Top Fundraiser at \$9,000. Donations will continue to be accepted through the end of December. Thank you all for your generous donations to the Walk on my behalf.

The House and Senate successfully passed two pieces of legislation that will keep Alzheimer's as a priority. President Biden has officially signed the reauthorization of the National Alzheimer's Project Act (NAPA) and the Alzheimer's Accountability and Investment Act (AAIA) into law. Together, NAPA and AAIA advance the national strategic plan for Alzheimer's through 2035. This is a huge win for the 7 million Americans living with Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Advocacy works!!!
