#### Legislative Report (David Carmack • 240-578-4965)

President Trump continues to take many actions, too numerous to discuss here, that affect the Federal Civil Service. The House of Representatives approved, along party lines, the budget resolution discussed in the previous NARFE Chapter 409's newsletter. Remember, that resolution directs the House Committee on Oversight and Government to reduce spending under its jurisdiction by at least \$50 billion. NARFE says that the most likely source for such a reduction is from cuts to federal retirement and health benefits. NARFE continues to fight for federal employees and annuitants.

The Social Security Administration has begun to pay retroactive benefits to those affected by the repeal of the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO). The increased monthly benefits due to the repeal of the WEP and GPO are scheduled to begin in the April Social

Security payment. If you have not filed for Social Security because you believed that you would receive nothing by virtue of the WEP and/or GPO, please apply for Social Security now. The fastest way to apply is through the Social Security Administration (SSA) website, <u>www.ssa.gov/apply</u>, or you can call the SSA at **1-800-772-1213** (Monday – Friday from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM). When you are asked "How can I help you today?", you say "Fairness Act."

#### Alzheimer's Report (Kathy Siggins • 301-829-2462)

The first-ever county-level estimates of the prevalence of Alzheimer's dementia in people 65 and older were released at the Alzheimer's Association International Conference by researchers from Rush Medical College in Chicago. They found that Maryland has the highest prevalence of Alzheimer's in the East and Southeastern regions with Baltimore City and Prince Georges County coming in second and fourth among the top 5 nationally. NARFE is continuing to fight alongside the Alzheimer's Association to find a cure.
